The First Lady of Ukraine, Olena Zelenska, created the Foundation to engage the international connections in helping Ukraine. The Foundation attracts foreign support and directs it in providing systematic help for people in Ukraine.

The Foundation's core value is people. We stand by everyone affected by the war. We unite the world around millions of stories of people from Ukraine who need help and, step by step, restore their lives. It is on their stories that the future history of the entire country depends.

Areas of Activity

EDUCATION

The Foundation harnesses international resources to rebuild educational institutions damaged by the war and provide material and technical resources for continuous education

HEALTHCARE

The Foundation restores access to healthcare for people from the de-occupied regions of Ukraine

HUMANITARIAN AID

We provide people in Ukraine affected by the war, primarily in the de-occupied territories and foster families, with everything they need to live in decent conditions: light and heat sources, hygiene products and food, educational and household appliances, etc.

The war has greatly exacerbated the need to use digital technologies, which are the only way to ensure continuous access to education at this time

In the aftermath of the full-fledged invasion, a large number of participants in the educational process were forced to leave their homes.

Some of schoolchildren and teachers stayed in regions where it is impossible to continue learning offline due to constant shelling and missile strikes.

1 600 schools have been damaged or destroyed. A large number of Ukrainian schools operate in online or mixed formats.

Almost all Ukrainian schools (even those that operate offline) also have a mandatory element of online learning. It was created for those schoolchildren who were forced to go abroad and for those who are internally displaced but continue to study online at their schools.

In this regard, the problem of the lack of access to tablets, laptops, computers and high-quality Internet for studying and working has become acute for many schoolchildren and teachers.

TABLETS AND LAPTOPS FOR SCHOOLCHILDREN

Categories of schoolchildren in need:

Internally displaced persons, who have moved from the territories where hostilities are taking place or temporarily occupied

Schoolchildren from vulnerable groups (people with disabilities, children from low-income families, etc.)

Schoolchildren from certain categories: orphans, children deprived of parental care

Schoolchildren from large families

The Foundation together with partners (the Embassy of Ukraine in South Korea, HP and Microsoft) provided devices for 500 Ukrainian children. By the end of summer, we expect about 8,000 more devices from our partners Amazon, UAE, Santander (Spain).

LAPTOPS FOR TEACHERS

The Foundation has already covered part of the need and delivered 38 856 devices to teachers from 12 Ukrainian priority regions, including regions close to combat zones and the ones which host the IDPs. But the unmet need, including in partially covered regions, still remains.

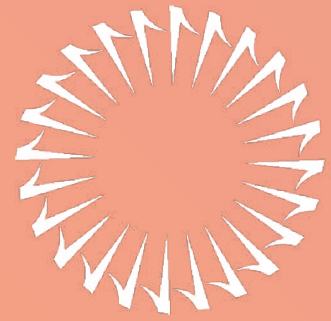
